### 1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide the Shareholders with information in respect of certain resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to be held on Friday, 26 April 2024.

### 2. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

In accordance with article 84(1) of the Articles of Association, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three, the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire at the Annual General Meeting. In addition, in accordance to the letters of appointment signed between (i) the non-executive Director and the Company; and (ii) each of the independent non-executive Directors and the Company, the term of appointment of each non-executive Director and independent non-executive Director is one year subject to re-election by the Shareholders at each annual general meeting of the Company.

Accordingly, Mr. Yang Xianxiang, Mr. Liu Kecheng, Ms. Yang Xin, Mr. Tse Siu Ngan, Dr. Liu Ka Ying, Rebecca and Dr. Hu Mantian (Mandy) will retire at the Annual General Meeting. All of the above retiring Directors, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

### Procedure and Process for Nomination of Directors

The Company has adopted the Nomination Policy which sets out the selection criteria and process and the Board succession planning considerations in relation to nomination and appointment of Directors of the Company.

### Selection Criteria

The Nomination Policy sets out the factors for assessing the suitability and the potential contribution to the Board of a proposed candidate, including but not limited to the following:

- (i) character and integrity;
- (ii) qualifications including professional qualifications, skills, knowledge and experience that are relevant to the Company's business and corporate strategy;
- diversity in all aspects, including but not limited to gender, age (18 years or above), cultural
  and educational background, ethnicity, professional experience, skills, knowledge and length of
  service;
- (iv) requirements of independent non-executive Directors on the Board and independence of the proposed independent non-executive Directors in accordance with the Listing Rules; and
- (v) commitment in respect of available time and relevant interest to discharge duties as a member of the Board and/or Board committee(s) of the Company.

### Recommendation of the Nomination Committee

The Nomination Committee has reviewed the structure and composition of the Board, the confirmations and disclosures given by the Directors, the qualifications, skills and experience, time commitment and contribution of the retiring Directors with reference to the nomination principles and criteria set out in the Nomination Policy and the Company's Board Diversity Policy, the Company's corporate strategy, and the independence of all independent non-executive Directors.

The Nomination Committee and the Board are of the view that each of the retiring Directors will continue to provide valuable contributions and balanced views to the Board and, having considered the depth and breadth of their professional experience, educational background and knowledge, it is satisfied that each of the retiring Directors will continue to contribute to the diversity of the Board. In assessing the independence of each of the independent non-executive Directors, the Nomination Committee and the Board considered the annual confirmation of independence giving by each of them and noted that they have no relationship with any Directors, chief executive, senior management of substantial Shareholders of the Company. The Nomination Committee and the Board are satisfied that each of the independent non-executive Directors has the required character, integrity, independence and experience to fulfil the role of an independent non-executive Director. The Nomination Committee has therefore recommended the re-election of all the retiring Directors who is/are due to retire at the Annual General Meeting.

Biographical details of the retiring Directors proposed to be re-elected at the Annual General Meeting are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

### 3. PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATE TO BUY BACK SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 24 April 2023, a general mandate was granted to the Directors to buy back Shares. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. In order to give the Company the flexibility to buy back Shares if and when appropriate, an ordinary resolution will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to approve the granting of the Share Buyback Mandate to the Directors to buy back Shares on the Stock Exchange of not exceeding 5% of the total number of issued Shares of the Company as at the date of passing of the proposed ordinary resolution contained in item 11 of the notice of the Annual General Meeting as set out on pages 43 to 48 of this circular (i.e. a total of 134,131,668 Shares on the basis that no further Shares are issued or bought back before the Annual General Meeting). The Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plan to buy back any Shares pursuant to the Share Buyback Mandate.

An explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to provide the Shareholders with requisite information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the granting of the Share Buyback Mandate is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

### 4. PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 24 April 2023, a general mandate was granted to the Directors to issue Shares. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. In order to give the Company the flexibility to issue Shares if and when appropriate, an

ordinary resolution will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to approve the granting of the Issuance Mandate to the Directors to issue, allot or deal with additional Shares of not exceeding 1.5% of the total number of issued Shares of the Company as at the date of passing of the proposed ordinary resolution contained in item 12 of the notice of the Annual General Meeting as set out on pages 43 to 48 of this circular (i.e. a total of 402,395,500 Shares on the basis that no further Shares are issued or bought back before the Annual General Meeting). An ordinary resolution to extend the Issuance Mandate by adding the number of Shares bought back by the Company pursuant to the Share Buyback Mandate will also be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

### 5. PROPOSED ADOPTION OF NEW SHARE SCHEME

### (1) Introduction

The Company adopted a share option scheme on 10 September 2010, which has since expired. There were 718,000 outstanding share options under such scheme as at the Latest Practicable Date.

As the Company does not currently have a share option scheme, the Company proposes to adopt the Share Scheme in compliance with the amendments of Chapter 17 of the Listing Rules that came into effect on 1 January 2023, and to replace the Existing Share Award Scheme.

A summary of the principal terms of the Share Scheme is set out in the Appendix III to this circular.

# (2) The purpose

The purpose of the Share Scheme is to provide incentive to the Eligible Participants in order to promote the development and success of the business of the Group. The Share Scheme will give the Eligible Participants an opportunity to have a personal stake in the Company and will help motivate the Eligible Participants in optimising their performance and efficiency and attract and retain the Eligible Participants whose contributions are important to the long-term growth of the Group.

### (3) The conditions

The adoption of this Scheme is conditional upon:

- (1) the passing of the necessary ordinary resolution at a general meeting of the Company approving the adoption of this Scheme; and
- (2) the Listing Committee of the Stock Exchange granting approval for the listing of, and permission to deal, in the Shares which may fall to be allotted and issued by the Company upon the exercise of the Awards that may be granted under this Scheme.

### (4) The Eligible Participants

The Eligible Participants include the Employee Participants and the Related Entity Participants.

In determining the basis of eligibility for Employee Participants, the factors in assessing whether any person is eligible to participate in this Scheme include: (1) the performance; (2) the skill, knowledge, experience, expertise and other personal qualities; (3) time commitment, responsibilities or employment conditions according to the prevailing market practice and industry standard; (4) the length of employment with the Group; and (5) the contribution or potential contribution to the development and growth of the Group.

Whilst the scope of the Eligible Participants is not limited to the employees of the Group and the Directors, the Company considers that the Related Entity Participants have made and may continue to make contributions to the Group. In determining the basis of eligibility for Related Entity Participants, the Board would take into account the experience of the Related Entity Participant on the Group's businesses, the actual degree of involvement in and/or cooperation with the Group and length of collaborative relationship the Related Entity Participant has established with the Group, and the amount of support, assistance, guidance, advice, efforts and contributions the Related Entity Participant has exerted and given towards the success of the Group and/or the amount of potential support, assistance, guidance, advice, efforts and contributions the Related Entity Participant is likely to be able to give or make towards the success of the Group in the future.

The Board (including the independent non-executive Directors) is of the view that the inclusion of Related Entity Participants as Eligible Participants, the criteria of selection of the Eligible Participants, and the terms of the grants are fair and reasonable and align with the purpose of the Share Scheme to recognise contributions made and to be made to the growth and development of the Group and the long term interests of the Company and its Shareholders.

### (5) Exercise Price and Issue Price of Awards

- (a) The Exercise Price shall be determined by the Board at its absolute discretion, provided that it shall not be less than the highest of:
  - (1) the closing price of the Shares as shown in the daily quotations sheet of the Stock Exchange on the offer date, which must be a Business Day;
  - (2) the average of the closing prices of the Shares as shown in the daily quotations sheets of the Stock Exchange for the five (5) consecutive days on which the Shares are traded on the Stock Exchange immediately preceding the offer date; and
  - (3) the nominal value of the Share on the offer date.

(b) The Issue Price shall be such price determined by the Board in its absolute discretion and notified to the Grantee in the Offer Letter. For the avoidance of doubt, the Board may determine the Issue Price to be nil.

Such flexibility will allow the Board the discretion in setting out the terms of the Awards under the prescribed parameters and facilitate the Board to offer suitable incentives to quality personnel that are valuable to the development of the Group and align with the purpose of the Share Scheme to recognise contributions made to the growth and development of the Group.

### (6) Vesting Period

The vesting period of the Awards is set out in the section headed "5. VESTING PERIOD" in Appendix III. The same section also sets out circumstances in which the Board may grant Awards with a vesting period shorter than the Minimum Period.

The Board and the Remuneration Committee are of the view that (i) there are certain instances (for example in circumstances (1) to (3) set out in the section headed "5. VESTING PERIOD" of Appendix III to this circular) where a strict twelve (12)-month vesting requirement would not be fair to the holder(s) of the Awards; (ii) there is a need for the Company to retain flexibility to reward exceptional performers with accelerated vesting period or in exceptional circumstances where justified; and (iii) the Company should be allowed to formulate its own talent recruitment and retention strategies in response to changing market conditions and industry competition. It should have the flexibility to impose vesting conditions such as performance-based vesting conditions instead of time-based vesting criteria depending on individual circumstances.

As such, the Board and the Remuneration Committee are of the view that the circumstances when vesting period is shorter than the Minimum Period prescribed in the section headed "5. VESTING PERIOD" of Appendix III to this circular are appropriate and align with the purpose of the Share Scheme.

### (7) Maximum number of Shares subject to the Share Scheme

The total number of Shares which may be issued in respect of all Awards which may be granted under the Share Scheme is set out in the section headed "7. SCHEME LIMITS AND ADDITIONAL APPROVALS" in Appendix III.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of issued Shares was 2,682,633,360 Shares. Assuming that there will be no change in the number of issued Shares between the Latest Practicable Date and the Adoption Date, the total number of Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all Awards to be granted under the Share Scheme together with all options and awards which may be granted under any other schemes for the time being of the Company would be 268,263,336 Shares, representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company on the date of approval of the Share Scheme.

### (8) Performance targets and clawback mechanism

The Board may at its discretion determine any performance target a Grantee is required to achieve before the relevant Award can be exercised and/or any clawback mechanism for the Company to recover or withhold any Awards granted to any Eligible Participants. Such flexibility will allow the Board the discretion in setting out the terms and conditions of the Awards under particular circumstances of each grant and facilitate the Board to offer suitable incentives to attract and retain quality personnel and align with the purpose of the Share Scheme to recognise contributions made to the development of the Group. Further details in respect of the performance targets and/or any clawback mechanism that the Board may impose as a condition of a grant are set out under the section headed "10. TIME OF EXERCISE OF OPTIONS" in Appendix III.

### (9) Others

The Board and the Remuneration Committee are of the view that the provisions of the Share Scheme, including, among others, the eligibility of the participants, the exercise price, the performance target and clawback mechanism are appropriate and align with the purpose of the Share Scheme.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company has no concrete plan to grant Awards under the Share Scheme immediately after its adoption.

The Company understands that whilst the Share Scheme is not restricted to executives and employees of the Group, the adoption of the Share Scheme would not constitute an offer to public and prospectus requirements under the Companies (Winding Up and Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance (Chapter 32 of the Laws of Hong Kong).

None of the Directors is and will be trustee of the Share Scheme nor has a direct or indirect interest in the trustee.

The Company will, where applicable, comply with the applicable requirements under Chapter 17 of the Listing Rules in respect of the operation of the Share Scheme.

To the best knowledge, information and belief of the Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, as at the Latest Practicable Date, no Shareholder had any material interest in the adoption of the Share Scheme. Accordingly, no Shareholder is required to abstain from voting on the resolution approving the adoption of the Share Scheme.

The Company has adopted the Existing Share Award Scheme on 13 September 2017 to provide incentives to attract and retain employees whose contributions will be beneficial to the growth and development of the Group. The Existing Share Award Scheme has a term of ten years and will expire on 12 September 2027. It is intended that the Existing Share Award Scheme will be cancelled upon the adoption of the Share Scheme.

### (10) Application for Listing

Application will be made to the Listing Committee of the Stock Exchange for the approval of the listing of, and permission to deal in, the Shares which may fall to be issued and allotted pursuant to the exercise of any Award that may be granted under the Share Scheme.

### (11) Document on display

A copy of the Share Scheme will be published on the websites of the Stock Exchange at www.hkexnews.hk and the Company at http://www.sitc.com for a period of not less than 14 days before the date of the AGM and is also made available for inspection at the AGM.

# 6. PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION AND ADOPTION OF THE THIRD AMENDED AND RESTATED ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

Reference is made to the announcement of the Company dated 7 March 2024.

The Board proposed to amend the existing Articles of Association to (i) bring the Articles of Association in line with the latest requirements under the Listing Rules, including the amendments to Rule 2.07A which took effect from 31 December 2023; and (ii) incorporate certain corresponding and housekeeping amendments to the existing Articles of Association (the "**Proposed Amendments**").

The Board further proposed to effect the Proposed Amendments by way of adoption of the Third Amended and Restated Articles of Association in substitution for, and to the exclusion of, the existing Articles of Association.

Details of the Proposed Amendments are set out in Appendix IV to this circular. The Third Amended and Restated Articles of Association is prepared and written in English. The Chinese translation of the Third Amended and Restated Articles of Association is for reference only. In the event of any discrepancy or inconsistency, the English version shall prevail.

The legal advisers to the Company as to the laws of Hong Kong laws has confirmed that the Proposed Amendments conform with the applicable requirements under the Listing Rules. The legal advisers to the Company as to the laws of the Cayman Islands has confirmed that the Proposed Amendments do not violate the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands. The Company confirms that there is nothing unusual about the Proposed Amendments for a Cayman Islands company listed on the Stock Exchange.

The Proposed Amendments and the proposed adoption of the Third Amended and Restated Articles of Association are subject to the approval of the Shareholders by way of a special resolution at the Annual General Meeting and shall take effect upon passing of the special resolution at the Annual General Meeting. Prior to the passing of such special resolution, the existing Articles of Association shall remain valid.

### 7. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND PROXY ARRANGEMENT

The notice of the Annual General Meeting is set out on pages 43 to 48 of this circular.

Pursuant to the Listing Rules and the Articles of Association, any vote of Shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll except where the chairman decides to allow a resolution relating to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands. An announcement on the poll results will be published by the Company after the Annual General Meeting in the manner prescribed under the Listing Rules.

A form of proxy for use at the Annual General Meeting is enclosed with this circular and such form of proxy is also published on the websites of Hong Kong Exchanges and Clearing Limited (http://www.hkexnews.hk) and the Company (http://www.sitc.com). ### 8. RECOMMENDATION

# EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE SHARE BUYBACK MANDATE

The following is an explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to provide the Shareholders with requisite information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting in relation to the granting of the Share Buyback Mandate.

### 1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 2,682,633,360 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution set out in item 11 of the notice of the Annual General Meeting in respect of the granting of the Share Buyback Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or bought back before the Annual General Meeting, i.e. being 2,682,633,360 Shares, the Directors would be authorized under the Share Buyback Mandate to buy back, during the period in which the Share Buyback Mandate remains in force, a total of 134,131,668 Shares, representing 5% of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of the Annual General Meeting.

### 2. REASONS FOR SHARE BUY-BACK

The Directors believe that the granting of the Share Buyback Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders.

Share buy-back may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a buy-back will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

### 3. FUNDING OF BUY-BACK

The Company may only apply funds legally available for share buy-back in accordance with its Memorandum and Articles of Association, the laws of the Cayman Islands and/or any other applicable laws, as the case may be.

# 4. IMPACT OF BUY-BACK

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2023) in the event that the Share Buyback Mandate was to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed buy-back period. However, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Share Buyback Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

### 6. GENERAL

To the best of their knowledge and having made all reasonable enquiries, none of the Directors nor any of their respective close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the granting of the Share Buyback Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

on the level of increase in the Shareholder's interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and thereby become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

To the best knowledge of the Company, as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Yang Shaopeng, together with a discretionary trust of which he is a founder, was interested in 1,108,413,544 Shares, representing approximately 41.32% of the total issued share capital of the Company. In the event that the Directors exercise the proposed Share Buyback Mandate in full, the aggregate shareholding of Mr. Yang Shaopeng would increase to approximately 43.49% of the issued share capital of the Company, and such increase would give rise to an obligation of Mr. Yang Shaopeng and his associates to make a mandatory general offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

Nevertheless, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Share Buyback Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code and/or result in the aggregate number of Shares held by the public shareholders falling below the prescribed minimum percentage required by the Stock Exchange.

### 8. BUY-BACK OF SHARES MADE BY THE COMPANY

During the six months prior to the Latest Practicable Date, the Company had not bought back any of the Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise).

The following is a summary of the principal terms of the Share Scheme to be approved and adopted by ordinary resolution at the annual general meeting, but such summary does not form part of, nor was it intended to be, part of the Share Scheme, nor should it be taken as affecting the interpretation of the rules of the Share Scheme:

### 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of the Share Scheme is to provide incentive to the Eligible Participants in order to promote the development and success of the business of the Group. The Share Scheme will give the Eligible Participants an opportunity to have a personal stake in the Company and will help motivate the Eligible Participants in optimising their performance and efficiency and attract and retain the Eligible Participants whose contributions are important to the long-term growth of the Group.

### 2. ADMINISTRATION OF THE SHARE SCHEME

The Share Scheme shall be subject to the administration of the Board whose decision on all matters arising in relation to the Share Scheme or its interpretation or application or effect shall (save as otherwise provided in the Share Scheme and in the absence of manifest error) be final and binding. For the avoidance of doubt, subject to compliance with the requirements of the Listing Rules and the provisions of the Share Scheme, the Board shall have the right to (i) interpret and construe the provisions of the Share Scheme; (ii) determine the persons who will be offered Awards under the Share Scheme, and the number of Shares and the Exercise Price or Issue Price in relation to such Awards; (iii) make such appropriate and equitable adjustments to the terms of Awards granted under the Share Scheme as it may deem necessary; and (iv) make such other decisions or determinations or regulations as it shall deem appropriate for the administration of the Share Scheme.

Subject to compliance with the Listing Rules, the authority to administer the Share Scheme may be delegated by the Board to a committee of the Board or to any other person(s) deemed appropriate at the sole discretion of the Board.

The Company may establish a trust (the "**Trust**") and appoint a trustee independent of the Company and its connected person for the purposes of: (i) holding Award Shares allotted and issued by the Company and reserved for specified Eligible Participants; (ii) settling Awards; and (iii) taking other actions for the purposes of administering and implementing the Share Scheme. The trustee of the Trust shall be instructed by the Company.

The trustee of the Trust holding unvested Award Shares, whether directly or indirectly, shall abstain from voting on matters that require Shareholders' approval under the Listing Rules. For the avoidance of doubt, no Award Shares (i.e. Shares underlying a Share Award or a Share Option) will be entitled to vote at any general meeting of the Company until and unless they have been vested and transferred to the Grantee.

### 3. ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS AND THE BASIS OF ELIGIBILITY

The Eligible Participants are the Employee Participants and the Related Entity Participants.

In determining the basis of eligibility for Employee Participants, the factors in assessing whether any person is eligible to participate in the Share Scheme include: (1) the performance of the Employee Participant; (2) the skill, knowledge, experience, expertise and other personal qualities of the Employee Participant, (3) the time commitment, responsibilities or employment conditions of the Employee Participant according to the prevailing market practice and industry standard; (4) the length of employment with the Group; and (5) the contribution or potential contribution of the Employee Participant to the development and growth of the Group.

In determining the basis of eligibility for Related Entity Participants, the Board would take into account the experience of the Related Entity Participant on the Group's businesses, the actual degree of involvement in and/or cooperation with the Group and length of collaborative relationship the Related Entity Participant has established with the Group, and the amount of support, assistance, guidance, advice, efforts and contributions the Related Entity Participant has exerted and given towards the success of the Group and/or the amount of potential support, assistance, guidance, advice, efforts and contributions the Related Entity Participant is likely to be able to give or make towards the success of the Group in the future.

### 4. OFFER AND ACCEPTANCE

Subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the Share Scheme and the Listing Rules, the Board shall be entitled (but shall not be bound), at any time and from time to time and within a period commencing on the Adoption Date and ending on the Termination Date (both dates inclusive), to make an Offer to such Eligible Participant as it may, in its absolute discretion, select, and subject to such conditions as the Board may think fit, provided that no such Offer shall be made if a prospectus is required to be issued under the Companies (Winding Up and Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance (Chapter 32 of the Laws of Hong Kong) or any applicable laws or if such grant will result in the breach by the Company or any of the Directors of any applicable securities laws and regulations in any jurisdiction.

An Offer shall be made to an Eligible Participant in writing (and unless so made shall be invalid) in such form as the Board may from time to time determine (including where applicable through the Company's internal OA system or through other electronic means) specifying the terms of the Award which may include number of Award Shares, the Issue Price or Exercise Price (as applicable), the vesting criteria and conditions, the Exercise Period, any minimum performance targets that must be achieved, the clawback mechanism for the Company to recover or withhold any Share Options or Share Awards granted to any Eligible Participants, and any such other details as the Company may consider necessary, and requiring the Grantee to undertake to hold the Award on the terms of the offer letter and be bound by the provisions of the Share Scheme. An Offer shall remain open for acceptance by the Eligible Participant concerned (and by no other person, including the Eligible Participant's personal representative) for a period of five (5) Business Days from the date of offer.

An Offer shall be deemed to have been accepted by an Eligible Participant concerned in respect of all the Award Shares which are offered to such Eligible Participant when the duplicate letter or acknowledgment comprising acceptance of the Offer duly signed or acknowledged (including where applicable through the Company's internal OA system or through other electronic means) by the

Eligible Participant, together with a payment in favour of the Company of HK\$1.00 or such other amount (if any) that may be determined by the Board as consideration for the grant thereof, is received by the Company.

Any Offer may be accepted by an Eligible Participant in its entirety. To the extent that the Offer is not accepted within the stated period, it will be deemed to have been irrevocably declined and lapsed.

### 5. VESTING PERIOD

Save for the circumstances prescribed below, an Award must be held by the Grantee for a period that is not shorter than the Minimum Period before the Award can be exercised.

The Board may at its discretion grant Awards with a vesting period shorter than the Minimum Period in the following circumstances:

- (1) grants of "make-whole" Awards to new joiners to replace the share options or award shares they forfeited when leaving the previous employers;
- (2) grants to an Eligible Participant whose employment is terminated due to death or occurrence of any out of control event;
- (3) grants that are made in batches during a year for administrative and compliance reasons, which include Awards that should have been granted earlier if not for such administrative or compliance reasons but had to wait for subsequent batch;
- (4) grants of Awards with a mixed or accelerated vesting schedule such as where the Awards may vest evenly over a period of twelve (12) months; or
- (5) grants with performance-based vesting conditions in lieu of time-based vesting criteria.

Such discretion gives the Company more flexibility to (i) adapt to exceptional and justified circumstances; or (ii) attract talents or reward exceptional performers with accelerated vesting. These circumstances are also considered by the Stock Exchange to be justifiable reasons for having a shorter vesting period as set out in the consultation conclusions on the proposed amendments to the Listing Rules relating to share schemes of listed issuers published by the Stock Exchange in July 2022.

### 6. EXERCISE PRICE AND ISSUE PRICE AND EXERCISE OF AWARDS

- (a) The Exercise Price shall be determined by the Board at its absolute discretion, provided that it shall not be less than the highest of:
  - (1) the closing price of the Shares as shown in the daily quotations sheet of the Stock Exchange on the offer date, which must be a Business Day;

- (2) the average of the closing prices of the Shares as shown in the daily quotations sheets of the Stock Exchange for the five (5) consecutive days on which the Shares are traded on the Stock Exchange immediately preceding the offer date; and
- (3) the nominal value of the Share on the offer date.
- (b) The Issue Price shall be such price determined by the Board in its absolute discretion and notified to the Grantee in the Offer Letter. For the avoidance of doubt, the Board may determine the Issue Price to be nil.
- (c) Where an Award is to be granted under section 8 or section 9, for the purposes of the paragraph (a)(1) and paragraph (a)(2) above, the date of the meeting of the Board (or its authorized committee for the administration of the Share Scheme) or the remuneration committee thereof (as the case may be) at which the grant was proposed shall be taken to be the offer date for the relevant Award, and the provisions as set above shall apply *mutatis mutandis*.
- (d) Subject to the terms of the Share Scheme, an Award shall be exercisable in whole or in part by the Grantee (or, in the case of death of the Grantee, by the Grantee's Personal Representative) giving notice in writing to the Company stating that the Award is thereby exercised and the number of Award Shares in respect of which it is so exercised.
  - (i) Each of such notice must be accompanied by a remittance for the full amount of the Exercise Price or the Issue Price (as applicable) for the Award Shares in respect of which the notice is given.
  - (ii) Within twenty-one (21) days (or such longer period if the Company in its sole discretion considers it appropriate due to applicable legal or regulatory restrictions) after receipt of the notice and the remittance, the Company shall, at its discretion, arrange for the Exercised Award Shares to be satisfied in the following methods:
    - (aa) allot and issue the relevant number of Shares to the Grantee (or, the Grantee's estate in the event of an exercise by the Grantee's Personal Representative) credited as fully paid and instruct the Share Registrar to issue to the Grantee (or the Grantee's estate in the event of an exercise by the Grantee's Personal Representative) a share certificate for the Shares so allotted and issued; and
    - (bb) arrange for the Exercised Award Shares to be transferred to the Grantee (or the Grantee's estate in the event of an exercise by the Grantee's Personal Representative) credited as fully paid and issue to the Grantee (or the Grantee's estate in the event of an exercise by the Grantee's Personal Representative) a share certificate in respect of the Shares so transferred.

### 7. SCHEME LIMITS AND ADDITIONAL APPROVALS

#### The Scheme Mandate Limit

(1) The total number of Shares which may be issued in respect of all Awards which may be granted at any time under the Share Scheme together with options and awards which may be granted under any other schemes of the Company shall not exceed such number of Shares as equals 10% of the Shares in issue as at the Adoption Date (the "Scheme Mandate Limit"), which is 268,263,336 Shares. Awards lapsed in accordance with the terms of the Share Scheme (and other schemes of the Company) will not be regarded as utilised for the purpose of calculating the Scheme Mandate Limit.

#### Refreshment

- (2) (a) the Company may seek approval of the Shareholders in a general meeting of the Company to refresh the Scheme Mandate Limit under the Share Scheme on or after the third anniversary of the date of the Shareholders' approval for the last refreshment or the Adoption Date. The total number of Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all (i) the Awards under the Share Scheme and (ii) the options and awards to be granted under any other schemes of the Company as "refreshed" must not exceed 10% of the Shares in issue as at the date of approval of the refreshment. For the purpose of seeking approval of the Shareholders under this paragraph (2), the Company must send a circular to the Shareholders containing the information required under the Listing Rules; and
  - (b) any refreshment within any three-year period shall be subject to independent Shareholders' approval.

### Grant in excess of the Scheme Mandate Limit

(3) The Company may seek separate approval of the Shareholders in a general meeting of the Company for granting Awards exceeding the Scheme Mandate Limit provided that the Awards in excess of the Scheme Mandate Limit are granted only to Eligible Participants specifically identified by the Company before such approval is sought. For the purpose of seeking approval of the Shareholders under this paragraph (3), the Company must send a circular to the Shareholders containing a generic description of the specified Eligible Participants who may be granted such Awards, the number and terms of the Awards to be granted, the purpose of granting Awards to the specified Eligible Participants with an explanation as to how the terms of the Awards serve such purpose, and such other information as required under the Listing Rules. The number and terms (including the Exercise Price or the Issue Price) of the Awards to be granted to such Eligible Participant must be fixed before Shareholders' approval. For the grant of Share Options, the date of Board meeting for proposing such grant should be taken as the date of grant for the purpose of calculating the Exercise Price.

# 8. GRANT OF AWARDS TO A DIRECTOR, CHIEF EXECUTIVE OR SUBSTANTIAL SHAREHOLDER OF THE COMPANY OR ANY OF THEIR ASSOCIATES

- (1) Any grant of an Award to a Director, a chief executive of the Company or substantial shareholder (as defined under the Listing Rules), or any of their respective associates must be approved by the independent non-executive Directors (excluding any independent non-executive Director who or whose associate is the proposed Grantee of the Award).
- (2) (a) Where any grant of an Award to an independent non-executive Director or a substantial shareholder (as defined in the Listing Rules), or any of their respective associates, would result in the Shares issued and to be issued in respect of all options and awards granted (excluding any options and awards lapsed in accordance with the terms of the relevant schemes) to such person in the twelve(12)-month period up to and including the date of such grant representing in aggregate exceeding 0.1% of the Shares in issue, or
  - (b) where any grant of Share Awards (i.e., excluding grant of Share Options) to any Director (other than an independent non-executive Director) or chief executive of the Company), or any of their respective associates, would result in the shares issued and to be issued in respect of all awards granted (excluding any Awards lapsed in accordance with the terms of the relevant schemes) to such person in the 12-month period up to and including the date of such grant representing in aggregate over 0.1% of the Shares in issue at the date of such grant,

such grant of Option must be approved by the Shareholders in a general meeting of the Company.

- (3) The Company must send a circular to the Shareholders. The circular must contain such information required by the Listing Rules.
- (4) The Grantee, his associates and all the core connected persons must abstain from voting in favour of the proposed grant at such general meeting. Parties that are required to abstain from voting in favour of the proposed grant at the general meeting of the Company pursuant to Rule 17.04(4) of the Listing Rules may vote against the resolution at the general meeting of the Company, provided that their intention to do so has been stated in the relevant circular to the Shareholders.
- (5) Any vote taken at the general meeting of the Company to approve the grant of such Award must be taken on a poll and comply with the requirements under the Listing Rules.
- (6) Any change in the terms of Awards granted to an Eligible Participant who is a director, chief executive or substantial shareholder (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company, or any of their respective associates must be approved by the Shareholders in the manner as set out in the Listing Rules if the initial grant of the Awards requires such approval (except where the changes take effect automatically under the existing terms of the Share Scheme).

### 9. MAXIMUM ENTITLEMENT OF EACH ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANT

The grant of Awards to an Eligible Participant in any twelve(12)-month period must not in aggregate exceed 1% of the Shares in issue. Where any grant of an Award to an Eligible Participant would result in the Shares issued and to be issued in respect of all options and awards granted to such Eligible Participant (excluding any options and awards lapsed in accordance with the terms of the relevant schemes) in the twelve(12)-month period up to and including the date of such grant representing in aggregate exceeding 1% of the Shares in issue, such grant must be separately approved by the Shareholders in a general meeting of the Company with such Eligible Participant and the person's close associates (or associates if the Eligible Participant is a connected person) abstaining from voting.

The Company must send a circular to the Shareholders and the circular must disclose the identity of the Eligible Participant, the number and terms of the Awards to be granted (and Awards previously granted to such Eligible Participant during the twelve(12)-month period), the purpose of granting the Awards to the Eligible Participant, an explanation as to how the terms of the Awards serve such purpose and such information as may be required by the Stock Exchange from time to time. The number and terms (including the Exercise Price or Issue Price) of the Award to be granted to such Eligible Participant must be fixed before the general meeting of the Company. For the grant of Share Options, the date of the meeting of the Board for proposing such grant should be taken as the offer date for the purpose of calculating the Exercise Price.

### 10. TIME OF EXERCISE OF OPTIONS

Subject to the terms of the Share Scheme, an Award may be exercised in whole or in part at any time during the period stipulated in the Offer, provided that such period shall not go beyond the day immediately prior to the tenth anniversary of the offer date with respect of the relevant Award.

The Board may at its discretion specify any condition in the offer letter, including performance target or clawback mechanism, at the grant of the relevant Award which must be satisfied before an Award may be exercised. The exercise of the Options is subject to the Eligible Participants satisfying all such conditions, without triggering any clawback mechanism.

Such performance targets may include: (i) aggregate revenue of the Group for the relevant financial year (or the corresponding annual growth rate comparing with that of the immediately preceding financial year); (ii) market share of the Group's services for the relevant financial year (or the corresponding annual growth rate comparing with that of the immediately preceding financial year); (iii) net profit of the Group for the relevant financial year (or the corresponding annual growth rate comparing with that of the immediately preceding financial year); and/or (iv) other targets to be determined in the sole discretion of the Board. Grounds on which such clawback provisions may be triggered include: (i) resignation unilaterally and failure to meet the termination notice period requirements; (ii) being terminated for violating the relevant Company's regulations and discipline; (iii) been charged, convicted or held liable for any offence under the relevant securities laws in Hong Kong or any other applicable laws or regulations in force from time to time; (iv) breach of material regulations such as non-competition, confidentiality or Company's information security; (v) spreading adverse public opinion regarding Company's brands or image; (vi) material misstatement in the

audited financial statements of the Company that requires a restatement; (vii) if the Grant is linked to any performance targets and the Board or the Committee is of the view that there exists circumstances that show or lead to any of the prescribed performance targets having been assessed or calculated in a materially inaccurate manner; and/or (viii) other circumstances to be determined in the sole discretion of the Board or the Committee.

Save as determined by the Board and provided in the offer of the grant of the relevant Award, there is no performance target which must be achieved before an Award can be exercised under the terms of the Share Scheme nor any clawback mechanism for the Company to recover or withhold any Awards granted to any Eligible Participant.

### 11. RESTRICTIONS ON THE TIME OF OFFER

Offer may not be made:

- (1) after inside information (having the meaning defined in the Securities and Futures Ordinance, Chapter 571 of the Laws of Hong Kong) has come to the knowledge of the Company until (and including) the trading day after it has been announced pursuant to the requirements of the Listing Rules; and
- (2) during the period commencing from one (1) month immediately preceding the earlier of:
  - (a) the date of the meeting of the Board (as such date is first notified to the Stock Exchange in accordance with the Listing Rules) for approving the Company's results for any year, half-year or quarter-year period or any other interim period (whether or not required under the Listing Rules); and
  - (b) the deadline for the Company to publish its results for any year, half-year or quarteryear period under the Listing Rules, or any other interim period (whether or not required under the Listing Rules)

and ending on the date of the results announcements (or during any period of delay in publishing results announcements).

(3) with respect to an Eligible Participant who is subject to the Model Code for Securities Transactions by Directors of Listed Issuers ("Model Code") as set out in Appendix C3 of the Listing Rules during the periods or times in which such Eligible Participant is prohibited from dealing in the Shares pursuant to the Model Code.

### 12. RIGHTS ARE PERSONAL TO GRANTEES

An Award shall be personal to the Grantee and shall not be assignable and no Grantee shall in any way sell, transfer, charge, mortgage, encumber or create any interest whatsoever in favour of any third party over or in relation to any Award or enter into any agreement so to do. Any breach of the foregoing by a Grantee shall entitle the Company to cancel any Award or any part thereof granted to such Grantee to the extent not already exercised.

The Stock Exchange may consider granting a waiver to allow a transfer of an Award to a vehicle (such as trust or private company) for the benefit of the Grantee and any family members of such Grantee that would continue to meet purpose of this Scheme and comply with the requirements of the Listing Rules.

# 13. RIGHTS ON CESSATION OF EMPLOYMENT OR DIRECTORSHIP

In the event that the Grantee ceases to be an Eligible Participant by reason of termination of his employment with any member of the Group on any one or more of the following grounds:

- (1) that the Grantee has been guilty of serious misconduct;
- (2) that the Grantee has been convicted of any criminal offence involving the person's integrity or honesty or in relation to any member of the Group (if so determined by the Board);
- (3) that the Grantee has become insolvent, bankrupt or has made arrangements or compositions with the Grantee's creditors generally; or
- (4) on any other ground as determined by the Board that would warrant the termination of the Grantee's employment at common law or pursuant to any applicable laws or under the Grantee's service contract with any member of the Group,

before exercising the Award in full, the Grantee's Award (to the extent not already exercised) shall lapse and shall not be exercisable on the date of cessation, or such longer period as the Board may determine.

In the event that the Grantee, by reason of the Grantee's employment with any member of the Group, ceases to be an Eligible Participant by reason of retirement as an employee in accordance with the Grantee's contract of employment (all evidenced to the satisfaction of the Board), or the termination of the Grantee's employment with the Company provided that none of the events which would be a ground for termination of the Grantee's employment or directorship set out in the paragraph above arises, before exercising the Award in full, the Grantee may exercise the Award (to the extent not already exercised) in whole or in part within ninety (90) days following the date of such cessation, or such longer period as the Board may determine and such Award to the extent not so exercised shall lapse and determine at the end of the abovementioned period,

### 14. RIGHTS ON DEATH

In the event that the Grantee ceases to be an Eligible Participant by reason of the person's death before exercising the Award in full (and if the Grantee is an Employee Participant, provided that none of the events which would be a ground for termination of the person's employment or directorship under section 13 arises):

- (a) in the case of Share Options, the Grantee's Personal Representative may exercise the Share Options outstanding (whether vested or not) in whole or in part in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 6.3 within one hundred and eighty (180) days following the date of death, or such longer period as the Board may determine, and any Share Options not exercised shall lapse at the end of the abovementioned period;
- (b) in the case of Share Awards, the Grantee's Personal Representative may, within two (2) years following the date of death, or such other period as the Board may determine, request the Company to deliver any outstanding Share Awards to the Grantee's estate, or if the Grantee has no Personal Representative or in case of bona vacantia, the outstanding Share Awards shall be forfeited and cease to be transferable and lapse upon the expiry of the above period;

# 15. RIGHTS ON INJURY, DISABILITY, ILL-HEALTH

In the event that the Grantee, by reason of the Grantee's employment with any member of the Group, ceases to be an Eligible Participant by reason of injury, disability, ill-health before exercising the Award in full, the Grantee may exercise the Award (to the extent not already exercised) in whole or in part in accordance with the terms of the Share Option Scheme within thirty (30) days following the date of such cessation, or such longer period as the Board may determine and to the extent such Award not so exercised shall lapse and determine at the end of the abovementioned period.

### 16. RELATED ENTITY PARTICIPANT

In the event that the Grantee who is a Related Entity Participant ceases to be an Eligible Participant by reason of any one or more of the following grounds:

- (1) in the case of the Grantee who is a Related Entity Participant, that he/she ceases to be associated with the Related Entity as a result of resignation, termination, dismissal or retirement;
- (2) that there has been a breach of contract entered into between the Grantee and any member of the Group or the Related Entity;
- (3) that the Board, in its sole and absolute opinion, believes that the Grantee is no longer contributing to the development or success of the Group, or has become a competitor of any member of the Group;
- (4) that the Grantee has become bankrupt or insolvent or made any arrangement or composition with his creditors generally;

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- (5) that the Grantee has committed any serious misconduct, or
- (6) hat the Grantee has been convicted of any criminal offence (other than an offence which, in the sole and absolute opinion of the Board, does not bring the Grantee or any member the Group into disrepute).

the Award (to the extent vested but not already exercised) shall immediately lapse and shall not be exercisable on the date of cessation or such other date as the Board may otherwise determined.

### 17. RIGHTS ON CESSATION FOR OTHER REASONS

In the event that the Grantee ceases to be an Eligible Participant for any reason other than the reasons specified in section 13 to section 16 above, the Grantee's Award (to the extent not already exercised) shall lapse and shall not be exercisable on the date of cessation provided that in each case, the Board may, in its absolute discretion, decide that such Award or any part thereof shall not so lapse or determine such conditions or limitations to which the exercise of such Award will be subject to.

### 18. RIGHTS ON A CORPORATE TRANSACTION

- (a) If there is an event of change in control of the Company as a result of a merger, scheme of arrangement or general offer, or in the event of a dissolution or liquidation of the Company, the Company shall at its sole discretion determine whether the vesting dates of any Awards will be accelerated and/or or determine such conditions or limitations to which the exercise of such Award will be subject.
- (b) For the purpose of paragraph 18(a), "control" shall have the meaning as specified in The Codes on Takeovers and Mergers and Share Buy-backs issued by the SFC from time to time.

### 19. CANCELLATION OF AWARDS

If the Grantee has been found (i) guilty of serious misconduct, (ii) convicted of any criminal offence involving the person's integrity or honesty or in relation to any member of the Group (if so determined by the Board); (iii) insolvent, bankrupt or has made arrangements or compositions with the Grantee's creditors generally; (iv) involved in any event as determined by the Board that would warrant the termination of the Grantee's employment at common law or pursuant to any applicable laws or under the Grantee's service contract with any member of the Group, then any Award granted to the Grantee (to the extent not already exercised) shall be cancelled and not exercisable on the date of cessation, or such longer period as the Board may determine. Save the circumstances above, any Award granted may not be cancelled except with the consent of the relevant Grantee and the prior approval of the Board. Where the Company cancels Awards and makes a new grant to the same Grantee, such new grant may only be made under the Share Scheme with the available limit approved by the Shareholders as set out in section 7 above. The Awards cancelled will be regarded as utilised for the purpose of calculating the Scheme Mandate Limit.

#### 20. EFFECT OF ALTERATIONS TO SHARE CAPITAL

In the event of any alteration in the capital structure of the Company whilst any Option remains exercisable or whilst the Share Scheme remains in effect, and such event arises from a capitalisation issue, rights issue, consolidation, sub-division or reduction of the share capital of the Company (other than an issue of Shares as consideration in respect of a transaction), then, in any such case (other than in the case of capitalisation issue) the Company shall instruct the auditors or independent financial adviser to certify in writing:

- (1) the adjustment, if any, that ought in their opinion fairly and reasonably to be made either generally or as regards any particular Grantee, to:
- (2) the number or nominal amount of Shares to which the Share Scheme or any Awards relates (insofar as it is/they are unexercised); and/or
- (3) the Exercise Price or Issue Price of any Award,
